Summer is right around the corner and we wanted to let you know we have two new exciting offerings for this summer. First, we have purchased an online intervention program called i-Ready. i-Ready can be logged into anywhere in the world and you will receive your student's login by May 17th. The second exciting offering will be our first annual robotics camp. We are working on times and specific dates but are aiming to offer a FREE robotics camp for Athlos students. We will be sending more information out in the coming weeks.

An exciting offering for next year will be our extended kindergarten program. This will be available for students who are enrolled in our AM kindergarten. Last Day of School is May 31st

The last day of school is on Friday, May 31st. This will be an early release day. School will get out at 12:00 p.m. for grades 1–8. There will be breakfast offered in the morning but NO LUNCH will be served.

Breakfast and Lunch Balances

The end of the year is fast approaching and we ask that you keep an eye on your student's lunch account balance. If your student has a negative account, please make a payment as soon as possible. So you are aware, if a student is having a home lunch, they will not be able to purchase a milk or a water unless they have a positive balance in their meal account. If the student is eating a school lunch, they will not be able to purchase a second milk or water unless the student has a positive balance in their meal account. If you would like to pay on your student's account until the end of the year, please be aware that we will not be serving lunch on the last day of school, May 31st, as it is an early release day. Any money left in your student's account will carry over to the next school year.



Yearbook Update

We regret to inform you that we have identified multiple errors in our yearbooks and will not have an opportunity to fix the errors or

replace the yearbooks. Due to these errors, we will be reducing the cost of the yearbooks from \$15 to \$10. ATHLETIC NEWS

Athlos Athletic Curriculum (AAC) End of Year Assessments

The AAC Assessments will begin this week for students in grades 4–8. These assessments are designed to assess the overall health and abilities of your student. At the beginning and the end of each school year, we perform these tests to help us measure your student's progress and the effectiveness of the athletic movement curriculum. The nine assessments that your student will be performing are:

1.20 Yard Dash
2. Vertical Jump
3. Pacer
4. Straight Leg Raise
6. Balance
7. Hex Agility
8. Plank
9. BMI

5. Push Up

The BMI (Body Mass Index) assessment is a very common and easy way to assess students' health and is completely confidential! If you do not want your student to participate in the BMI assessment, they may opt out with a note or email from a guardian. In the past, we have had a like-gendered coach perform the Straight Leg Raise assessment. Because we now only have one female coach, some female students will need to be assessed by a male coach. This non-invasive test can be seen here: https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=U5u_OuOw6ho. During the test, a coach will observe the ankle from several feet away to determine the stretch angle. If you have any concerns with your female student being assessed by a male coach, please contact your child's coach.
